

Privacy Notice – Adverse Effect Intake

Corteva Agriscience and its affiliates (“Corteva,” “Company,” “we,” “us,” or “our”) want you to be familiar with how we collect, use, and disclose Personal Information in connection with adverse effects reporting. This notice is addressed to individuals who report adverse effects and individuals who are the subject of adverse effects that are reported to us.

This **Privacy Notice** supplements our Global Privacy Statement (<https://www.corteva.com/privacy.html>) and our United States Privacy Notice (<https://www.corteva.com/us-privacy-rights.html>) and describes our practices in connection with Personal Information collected for adverse effect reporting. CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL INFORMATION COLLECTED

“**Personal Information**” is information that identifies an individual or relates to an identifiable individual. We collect the following categories of Personal Information for adverse effect reporting:

Personal Information we receive from you for adverse effect reporting:

Identifiers	Such as first and last name, email address, telephone number, and date of birth.
Demographic Information	Such as age and gender.
Health Information	Such as symptoms and treatments administered.
Adverse Effects Information	Such as details regarding the chemical exposure event and the product used.

If you disclose any Personal Information relating to other people to us, you represent that you have the authority to do so and to permit us to use the information in accordance with this Privacy Statement.

PERSONAL INFORMATION PROCESSING PURPOSES

We process your Personal Information for the purposes of monitoring the safety of our pesticide products, which includes detecting, assessing and preventing adverse effects and

comply with global adverse effects reporting obligations. We may also use Personal Information for other legitimate business purposes, including:

Processing Purpose and Examples of Related Activities
Managing and operating our business for the purpose of our relationship with you or a legitimate interest. This includes managing product and service development; managing our records relating to manufacturing and other business activities; and carrying out data analysis.
Legal and compliance: Fulfilling our legal and compliance-related obligations, including complying with applicable laws; complying with legal processes; responding to requests from public and government authorities; Enforcing our terms and conditions and standards; protecting our operations; protecting the rights, privacy, or property of Company; responding to auditors; and allowing us to pursue available legal remedies and make insurance claims, defend claims, and limit the damages that Company may sustain.
Aggregation and/or anonymization: Aggregating and/or anonymizing Personal Information so that it will no longer be considered Personal Information.

DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

We disclose Personal Information collected for adverse effect reporting and response to the following third parties:

- Our affiliates;
- Regulatory authorities as required by law, or to address safety concerns; and
- Service providers as needed to process adverse event reporting information such as IT system and data hosting providers, and adverse event processing service providers. These third parties are contractually obliged to protect the confidentiality and security of personal information.

SECURITY

We seek to use reasonable organizational, technical, and administrative measures to protect Personal Information within our organization. Unfortunately, no data transmission or storage system can be guaranteed to be 100% secure. If you have reason to believe that your interaction with us is no longer secure, please immediately notify us in accordance with the “Contacting Us” section below.

RIGHTS AND REQUESTS

If you would like to request to access/review, correct, update, suppress/delete, object to, restrict or opt out of the processing of Personal Information, withdraw your consent where relied upon for processing, or if you would like to request to receive an electronic copy of your Personal Information, please feel free to contact us in accordance with the “Contacting Us” section below. We will respond to your request consistent with applicable law.

For your protection, we may need to verify your identity before implementing your request. We will try to comply with your request as soon as reasonably practicable.

RETENTION PERIOD

We retain Personal Information for as long as needed or permitted in light of the purpose(s) for which it was obtained as outlined in this Privacy Notice unless a longer retention period is required or permitted by applicable law.

USE OF SERVICES BY MINORS

The Adverse Effects Intake Form is not directed to individuals under the age of sixteen (16), and we do not knowingly collect Personal Information from individuals under 16.

CROSS-BORDER TRANSFER

Your Personal Information may be stored and processed in any country or region where we have facilities or engage service providers. By sharing Personal Information regarding an adverse effect with us, you understand that your Personal Information will be transferred to countries outside of your country or region of residence, including to the United States, which may have data protection rules that are different from those of your country or region. In certain circumstances, courts, law enforcement agencies, regulatory agencies, or security authorities in those other countries or regions may be entitled to access your Personal Information.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REGARDING THE EEA, SWITZERLAND AND UNITED

- **Processing** –your personal information will be processed on one or more of the following legal bases
 - Where we have a legitimate interest;
 - As necessary to comply with relevant law and legal obligations;
 - As necessary to protect the vital interest if an individual; or
 - With your consent
- **Your rights**, subject to applicable law, you have the right to :
 - Ask whether we hold personal information about you and information about how it is processed;
 - Request that inaccurate personal information is corrected;
 - Request deletion of personal information that is no longer necessary for the purposes underlying the processing, processed based on withdrawn consent, or processed in non-compliance with applicable legal requirements;
 - Request us to restrict the processing of personal information where the processing is inappropriate;
 - Object to the processing of personal information; and

- Request portability of personal information that you have provided to us (which does not include information derived from the collected information), where the processing of such personal information is based on consent or a contract with you and is carried out by automated means.

Consumer Health Data Privacy Statement – Adverse Effect Intake

Pursuant to the Washington My Health My Data Act and the Nevada Consumer Health Privacy Law (collectively, the “**Health Privacy Laws**”), Corteva Agriscience (“**we**,” “**us**,” or “**our**”) is providing the following details regarding the categories of consumer health data that we collect, use, and share about Washington and Nevada consumers.

Collection of Consumer Health Data

For purposes of this Privacy Statement, consumer health data means personal information that is linked or reasonably linkable to a consumer and that identifies the consumer's past, present, or future physical or mental health status.

We collect consumer health data from you when you report an adverse effect related to your use of a Corteva Agriscience product.

The consumer health data we may collect from you when you report an adverse effect and when you provide the information to us includes:

Health conditions, treatment, diseases, or diagnosis
Social, psychological, behavioural, and medical interventions
Health-related surgeries or procedures
Use or purchase of prescribed medication
Bodily functions, vital signs, symptoms, or measurements
Diagnoses or diagnostic testing, treatment, or medication
Information that could identify your attempt to seek health care services
Any inferences of the above categories of health data derived or extrapolated from non-health information

How We Use and Share Consumer Health Data

We collect, use, and share consumer health data for the purposes of monitoring the safety of our pesticide products, which includes detecting, assessing and preventing adverse effects and comply with global adverse effects reporting obligations.

We may also use consumer health data and share it with a third party in the context of any reorganization, financing transaction, merger, sale, joint venture, partnership, assignment, transfer, or other disposition of all or any portion of our business, assets, or stock (including in connection with any bankruptcy or similar proceedings). In certain circumstances, it may be necessary to provide consumer health data to other third parties, for example, to comply with applicable law or to protect the rights, safety or property of us, you, and others.

Individual Rights

If you are a Washington or Nevada consumer, you may make the following requests regarding your consumer health data, subject to applicable law and certain exceptions:

(1) Request to Know

You may request that we disclose:

- Whether we are collecting, sharing, or selling your consumer health data; and
- The third parties to whom we have shared or sold your consumer health data.

(2) Request to Opt-out

You may request to opt-out of the collection, sharing, or sale of your consumer health data.

(3) Request to Delete

You may request that we delete your consumer health data.

(4) Request to Access

If you are a Washington consumer, you may request that we provide you with:

- The email address or other online mechanism you can use to contact the third parties with whom your consumer health data is shared or sold; and
- A copy of your consumer health data.

If you are a Nevada consumer, you may request to review your consumer health data.

(5) Request to Amend

If you are a Nevada consumer, you may request that we make changes to your consumer health data.

We may need to request additional information from you in order to verify your identity and protect against fraudulent requests. If you make a Request to Delete, we may ask you to confirm your request before we delete your consumer health data.

If we refuse to take action on your request, you may appeal this refusal by contacting us at adverseeffects@corteva.com. If your appeal is unsuccessful, you can raise a concern or report a complaint with the Washington State Attorney General at <https://www.atg.wa.gov/file-complaint>.
